

Prints on Wood Panels Workshop:
April 12 11:30-5

This is my method of creating beautiful cost-effective prints to be able to share our favorite sold paintings, smaller versions of works, or even family pictures at an affordable price. I will demonstrate a step by step plan with a handout as we create our mini-masterpieces!

Supply list: (sharing supplies with a friend can be cost effective)

3-4 deep or thin wooden cradle panels 4x4, 6x6 or 6x8

(do NOT prepare in any way in advance)

1 sheet of "double tack paper" from Opus

(I suggest splitting a sheet with a friend)

1 ruler (I prefer 18") (tape measures don't work well)

1 pen that will write on shiny surfaces

(I use Pitt Pens or extra fine sharpies)

1" flat brush

Sharp scissors

Large cutting board

Your choice of paint color for sides of panel - anything you like

Spray varnish of your choice – I prefer high gloss

(brush on varnish will not work in this application)

Large exacto knife with a new blade

Rubber brayer/roller or wide plastic wedge – no metal

Water cup for brush washing, a few paper towels

Table covering

*You can choose to have your own images printed somewhere or do them yourself; they must be 1/8" (0.125) larger than your panel size

(I prefer printing on Staples Brand Glossy Brochure paper)

I will supply: (To keep your costs down and help with tech skills)

Printed images of your art in your choice of panel size

email me high quality jpeg images by April 6th

(if your image is dark, I will use photoshop to correct the white balance for you if you like)

Sanding blocks

Extra 1" flat brushes for those that don't have one

Parchment paper for spraying varnish

Pouring and fluid medium

Spray varnish high gloss

Alcohol pads

Q-tips

Posca pens for signing your work
